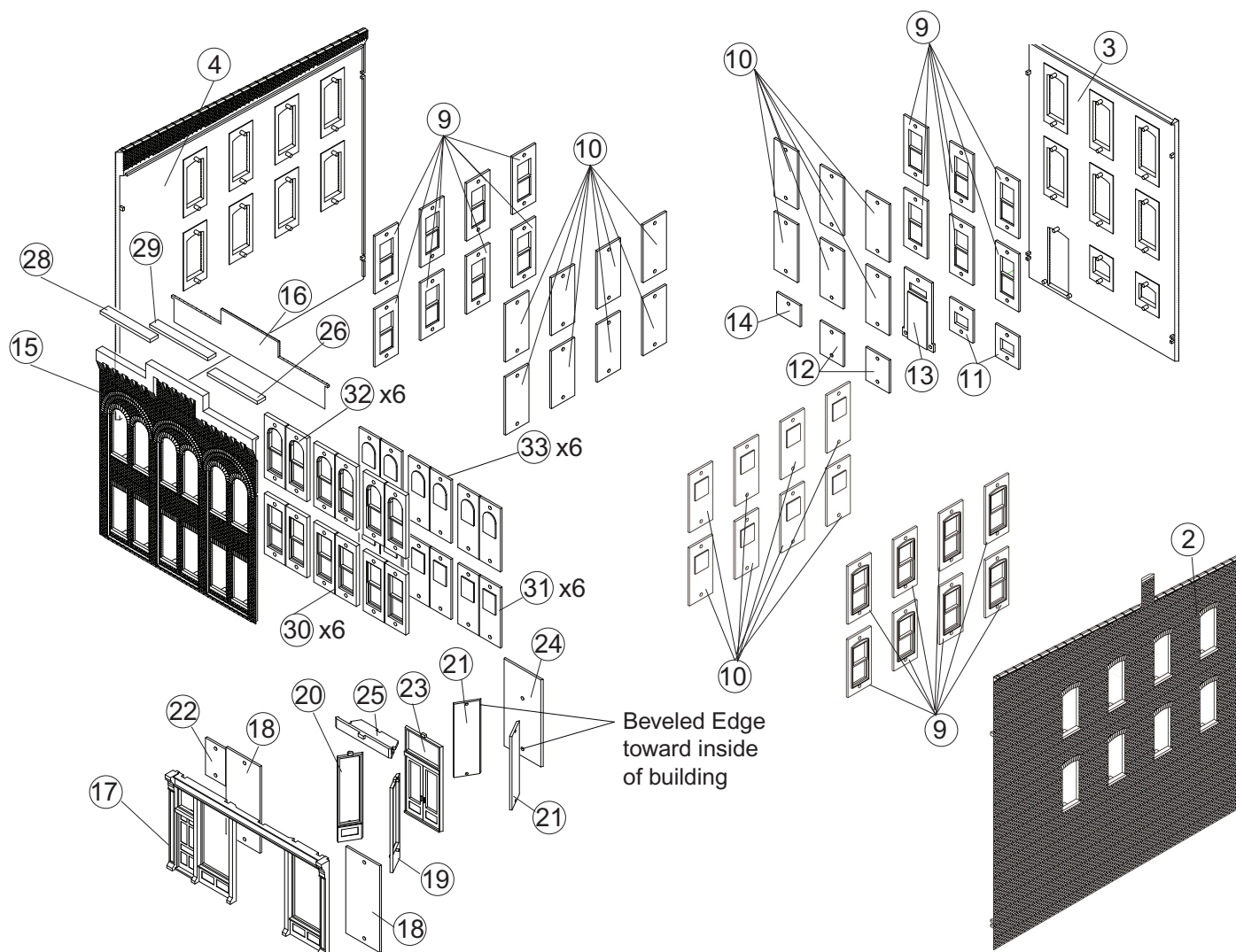

Thanks for purchasing this Cornerstone Series® kit. Please read all instructions and study the drawings before starting — directions for the interior graphics are printed directly on that sheet. All parts are styrene plastic, so use compatible glue. If you wish to decorate your model, use paints for plastic models. With appropriate details and signs, your finished model fits almost any era.

With a long history in almost every culture, beer first appeared about 6,000 years ago. And while drinking and driving never mix, the expansion of Roman roads in England created a need for resting places, called “tabernae,” (later “tavern” in English). As time passed, enterprising homeowners began making and selling malt ale out of their homes, which became popular places for locals and travelers alike. These gave way to public houses (“pubs” today), where homeowners purchased beer for resale. Beer had originally been served to customers directly at tables, but in later pubs, a counter was installed. Here, patrons ordered and paid for their drink and took it to tables, allowing the owner to serve more people in less time. Through the years, the services and specifics that differentiated bars, saloons, inns and pubs from each other have faded, but because the words are still associated with a particular era or type of establishment, they’re still used in the names of many businesses.

1. Glue Window and Door Frames to each Wall as shown. Glue Window Glass in place as shown.
2. Glue Back Cornice (16) to the front top of the Front Wall (15). Glue Cornice Tops (28, 29, 26) to top of Front Wall (15).
3. Glue Door Entry Frames (20, 23, 19) to Store Front Frame (17). Glue Door Entry Roof (25) to Store Front Assembly.
4. Glue Store Front Frame (17) to bottom of Front Wall (15).
5. Glue Window Glass (18, 21, 22, 24) to Store Front Assembly. Note: Beveled edge of Part 21 should face toward back of structure.



6. Glue the 4 Wall Assemblies (15, 2, 3, 4) to the Roof (27).
7. Glue three Chimney Sides (5, 6, 7) together. Then glue Chimney Assembly to Side Wall (2) to complete the four sides of the Chimney.
8. Glue the Chimney Cap (8) to top of Chimney Assembly.
9. The finished structure can be set on the Base (1) if you wish to add interior details at a later time, or glued in place to complete construction.
